### **Meeting Minutes October 14, 2014**

#### **Principal Update-Anne Erwin**

Back to school night had a great turn out. The school got great feedback about the new format. New format was intended to give parents a chance to get to know the teachers, not just focus on the syllabus. October 21<sup>st</sup> is Pizzicato "Dough for Dollars" fundraiser. 5% of sales for the day go to BHS. Attendance is disappointing, but not alarming. When attendance rate is 90% or lower it is a concern. BHS is focusing on attendance since you cannot make up lost instruction time when a student misses class. Counselors and Vice Principals are using reports to target high absenteeism/low grade students. The school is also looking to the student leadership to help motivate the student body. Overall looking to change the habit to "Positive Attendance". Anne urged parents to help kids be on time and ready to learn. She also acknowledged that there is never just one good answer to solve problems in schools.

#### **Student Body Update-Casey Cornwell**

The student leadership met and came up with ideas to help motivate the student body to attend. Ideas they came up with are setting a good example, using digital media to try to motivate and possible using a buddy system to have students contact each other when they are absent. This week is Pink Week and next week is Homecoming. The third week in November will be Respect Week. The focus will be overall kindness and anti-bullying. They are trying to get speaker Houston Craft to come. There will be lots of activities. The message will be choosing love and kindness. This Friday is "Beaver Migration" to Southridge for the Varsity football game. There was a question about a possible fund request to help pay for the speaker for Respect Week. Other avenues are being pursued to pay for it, but student leadership may come to Boosters if unable to find funds.

#### **Principal Update-Anne Erwin- Continued**

Homecoming is one of the great traditions of any school. It is a celebration of the school's legacy. There will be some Golden Grads attending. The theme this year is Wizard of Oz. The assembly will be on Friday.

#### **Concessions Update – Margie Lusk & Sallee Lines**

Debit/credit card sales are up to approximately 10% of sales. There was a suggestion of concession gift cards. Last year's best night during football was \$3800 in sales. This year that is the lowest we've had.

### **Holiday Bazaar-Margie Lusk**

All spots are filled and there is a waitlist. The bazaar is a fundraiser for Booster Club. The funds come from rent from the vendors and concessions. There are 40-50 students signed up to volunteer.

### **Centennial Task Force-Shelly Gourlay**

Lisa Sandmire will be the chair with Anne Erwin's help. 15 people will be meeting Thursday, Oct. 16 to set the schedule for the next 18 months. Currently the group includes representatives from Beaverton Historical Society, Golden Grads, BHS Administration, District Administration, BHS staff, Beaverton Mayor's office, BHS parents and Anne is still working on students to be a part of the project. The group will come to the next meeting with the timeline, an overview and committees to join for willing volunteers.

### **Funds Requests-Scott Reames**

1<sup>st</sup> request-Band: request is for 20 new pieces of sheet music. The music is expected to last 10 years and the request is for \$2000. BHS band has more students participating than any other comprehensive high school in Beaverton. The band impacts the whole school and the community.

With a \$1500 fund request from Boosters, they will be able to purchase the machine immediately and they will fundraise to fill their coffers for other needs. Girl's basketball will also be give concession stand shift at a home football playoff game if it occurs.

3<sup>rd</sup> request-Girl's Golf: request is for golf bags that are expected to last 3-5 years and the request is for \$1000. Bags will highlight school at a time when many eyes are on our program due to Gigi Stoll's participation.
