#### **Student Body Update: Jason Sarmiento**

This is prom week with an assembly on Friday and prom on Saturday. Prom is earlier than usual this year due to venue bookings.

For the month of May, the focus is community service. There will be a fundraiser for the program "Home Plate", a canned food drive, weekend community service opportunities and a supply drive.

#### **Principal Update-Anne Erwin**

Plans for "Future Days" on 5/19 and 5/20 are being finalized. By sending 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades to colleges and businesses while 11<sup>th</sup> grade takes the Smarter Balance test, it saves the school and students 10 instructional days.

This week is Vice Principal Appreciation Week.

On May 20<sup>th</sup>, BHS will be hosting incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grader chats. There will be 15-20 minutes chats with students, families and a staff member. There will also be opportunities for 1:1 tours with a current student and an open buffet from 4:30-8:30. The goal is to take the big school and make it small for the incoming students and to give BHS staff an opportunity to get to know the students. (Suggestion for a possible band outreach during the buffet) The logistics are still being worked out, but there may be an opportunity for current parents to volunteer and being a part of the interview process since they know what it is to be a BHS parent. Over 100 students have taken the opportunity to come for a shadow day.

#### **Success Fund Update-Anne Erwin and Scott Reames**

To date \$303,813 has been raised. The goal is to reach the match by the end of April.
